#### SUMMARY:

On March 12, 2020, Governor Newsom ordered (Executive Order N-25-20) that several public health measures be immediately implemented in response to the declaration of emergency, on March 4, 2020, due to the threat of the COVID-19 pandemic. In that order, the California Health & Human Services Agency (HHSA) and California Office of Emergency Services were directed to identify and make available - through executed agreements — hotels and other places of temporary residence suitable for use as temporary facilities for quarantine, isolation and treatment of individuals living unsheltered who test positive for COVID-19 and/or are considered vulnerable or

medically high risk if exposed. Tulare County initially contracted with two hotels to meet this directive and began accepting referrals for housing under Project Roomkey in April 2020.

On November 13, 2020, the California Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council (HCFC) made available \$300 million through Round Two of the Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) program to support local homeless initiatives including Project Roomkey. Eligible applicants for this funding include large cities, all counties, and all Continuums of Care.

The County of Tulare has been allocated \$406,102 through this program and the Tulare County Board of Supervisors authorized HHSA to apply for the HHAP Grant (Resolution No. 2021-0039) on January 12, 2021 with the intention of funding ongoing operating expenses associated with Project Roomkey hotel sites. The grant application was submitted to HCFC on January 22, 2021. A copy of Resolution 2021-0039 authorizing the grant application was submitted with the application.

On March 17, 2021, HCFC requested an amendment to the application which includes submission of a completed Homeless Emergency Aid Program Authorized Signatory Form in lieu of the Board Resolution that was submitted. The form identifies authorized HHAP designees for Tulare County as a component of the final grant application and authorizes those designees to sign the Standard Agreement in lieu of the Authorized Rep, if needed. HHSA will bring to the Board any future ratifications and/or new agreements, related documents for signatures.

In the 2020 Point-In-Time count, Tulare County was reported as having 992 individuals experiencing homelessness. Since implementation, Project Roomkey has consistently sheltered about ten percent of those individuals that previously indicated living unsheltered.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The Homeless Housing Assistance and Prevention Program is 100% State grant funded with no local match required. The revenue for these funds will amend the HHSA budget, line 001-142-1150-5064 in the amount of \$406,102. An AUD 308 is attached to modify the budget lines for Fiscal Year 20/21. There is no additional net County cost to the General Fund.

#### LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Quality of Life initiative to promote public health and welfare for all individuals in Tulare County. HHAP and Project Roomkey efforts will provide permanent housing opportunities for those experiencing homelessness, helping improve overall health outcomes within the community.
